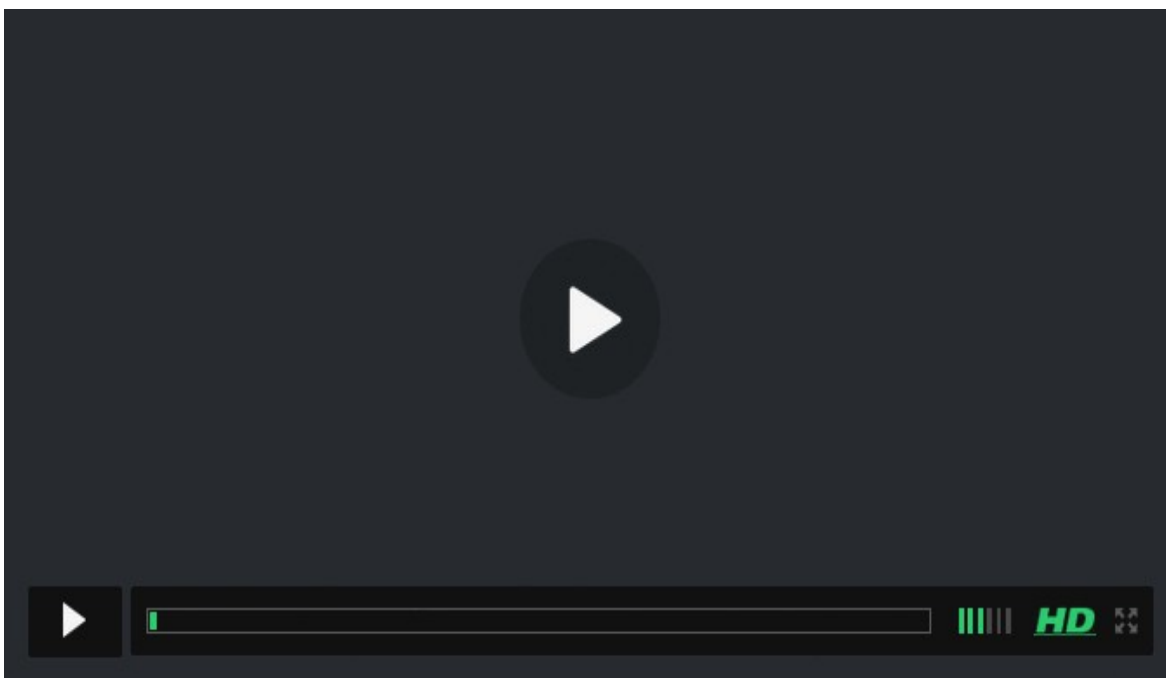

Here's everything you need to know heading into the SEC women's basketball tournament this week.

Can South Carolina survive again?

Between AP No. 3 South Carolina and No. 4 Texas, the SEC is on track to claim two top seeds in the NCAA tournament. But they aren't the only ones who could walk out of Greenville with the conference title this week.

Half of the top 10 in the Associated Press' latest poll are from the SEC, with Vanderbilt (5), LSU (6) and Oklahoma (7) joining the Gamecocks and Longhorns. Mikayla Blakes is averaging a nation-best 27.1 points per game at Vanderbilt, and she's had 12 30-point games this season — which is the most by an SEC player this century. South Carolina closed out the regular season on a 10-game win streak after sneaking past Kentucky late on Sunday. Kim Mulkey and LSU were within seven points of upsetting South Carolina last month, and the Sooners ended the season on a six-game win streak.

Though Texas went 28-3 this season and handled Oklahoma without much issue, the Longhorns' only losses came at the hands of the other three teams at the top of the league. Rori Harmon and Madison Booker, who shot just shy of 51% from the field, led Texas to a second-place finish in the conference. Despite the losses, the Longhorns were in place to claim the final No. 1 seed in ESPN's latest mock bracket before the tournament.

While the Gamecocks undoubtedly have the edge playing in their home state, and they've won nine of the past 11 tournaments, this may be the best SEC tournament field in recent memory. If someone is going to send them home early — and it could easily be any one of the other four teams at the top of the conference — this is the year.
